The Genesis

The idea of establishing a church at West Legon, a fast-developing community close to the University of Ghana, was conceived on the relocation of the Thompson Family from Nima to West Legon. Considering the distance and the inconvenience of having to travel to Nima for church services, the Thompson family decided to look for and fellowship with any nearby Presbyterian Church.

Later, one Mr. Sony Quartey who also reside in the neighbourhood, suggested they start a small church instead in the locality. This suggestion dovetailed into a programme that the Nima Presby BSPG has conceived, that is, to establish a church at this fast-growing community. Initially, Mr. Sony Quartey offered a small room at his residence to begin with when the BSPG leadership made up of Mr. Daniel kwasi Ayim, Mr. Isaac Torgbor and Mrs. Comfort Thompson went to meet with him. But later the mantle fell on the Thompson family to offer their garage as a meeting place when the Quarteys' offer did not materialize.

Growth:

Through evangelism: In January 1994, the idea to officially establish a church at West Legon was discussed with the then Nima District Minister, Rev. Eric Doku, who consented to the suggestion and immediately sent a delegation to conduct feasibility studies. In May 1994, the Bible Study and Prayer Group (BSPG) led by Mr. Daniel Ayim, Mr. Abbam Tettey and Catechist Juliet Kpentey embarked on a mass evangelism exercise in the area. This evangelism work effectively marked the beginning of the Grace Presby Church at West Legon.

Inaugural Service:

The first official service was held on Sunday, the 5th of June, 1994 and was attended by six (6) members in the adult service and twelve (12) Children in the Children Service. Two years after this significant milestone (in 1996) the Junior Youth Service also began.

First Baptism Ceremony:

A Church Extension Service was held on Sunday, 18th December, 1994 and some members from the Nima Presby Church and other invitees from the West Legon environs came together to

celebrate the occasion. During the service three (3) infants namely, Daniel Koranteng, Racheal Koranteng and Yaw Ntow were baptized.

Management Committee

As membership of the Church increased with most of them residing in and around West Legon, it became necessary to have a Management Committee from within West Legon. The following members were appointed to serve on the Interim Management Committee from 1997 until 2004 when Presbyters were elected to constitute the first Session.

Between 1994 and 1998, church services were held in the garage of the Thompson's residence but it soon became necessary to move to a bigger place. By this time also some prominent Presbyterians living in and around West Legon and their families had joined the Church. These included; Mr. George Dapaah, a Lecturer at the University of Ghana, Professor Emmanuel Ablade Glover, a renowned Artist, Mr. Maxwell Antwi-Bamfo, a Banker and Mr. Ebenezer Neequaye a Research Scientist at the CSIR Institute of Industrial Research. Many other members also joined the Church thus making it quite uncomfortable to continue to worship in the small garage. The need to look for a bigger place for worship therefore became increasingly urgent.

Acquisition of Land:

In 1995, considering the Church's need for expansion, the Thompsons found four (4) plots of land in the West Legon area, suitable for church activities. Unfortunately, due to lack of funds the Church was unable to acquire the land. Still convinced that a church must be established at West Legon, the Thompsons, in 1998 offered two (2) plots of their land at a subsidized cost to the Church for the construction of a church building. It is important to note here that the Thompson family, ten years later (in 2008) once again offered two (2) more plots of their remaining land, upon the persistent request from the Church. This was used for the construction of the current Church and Office Buildings.

Physical Development

Old Chapel:

Having acquired land in 1998, a decision was taken to put up a shed big enough for use temporarily as the Place of Worship. As the construction of the structure was in progress however, the Congregation became convinced that the shed idea ought to be discarded for the construction of a permanent structure instead. With the same enthusiasm therefore, members put their shoulders to the wheel and completed the Church Building within six years. Church Services thus moved



from the Garage to the New Church Building in May 16, 2004. (*Captured above*) Appendix 4 contains excerpts of Goodwill messages received on the occasion.


A few years later however, due to the increasing numbers of worshippers, it once again became necessary to expand the structure and this was done over time until there was eventually no more room for any further expansion. It became evident then that the Church needed to put up a bigger structure all together to accommodate its ever-increasing membership.


New Chapel Project:

With the vision of putting up a bigger auditorium for church services, in 2008, the Church once again approached the Thompsons and negotiated for more land for an expansion project. With the acquisition of two additional plots, the Church began its bold journey of faith, to build a new Chapel, befitting of the environs and vast enough to accommodate the rapidly expanding numbers

On May 1, 2011, Rev. Dr. Godwin Nii Noi Odonkor (the then Ga Presbytery Chairperson) performed the sod-cutting ceremony assisted by Rev. Ishmael Ako Ayeng (the then Minister-incharge), to mark the beginning of the construction of the new chapel. On Sunday, March 31, 2013 a Foundation Stone Laying Ceremony and dedication of the completed Basement of the Building was once again performed by the Rev. Dr. Godwin Nii Noi Odonkor. He was assisted by Rev. Lorna Khemchand (then District Minister – Nima) and Rev. Professor Cephas Omenyo (who was then the Minister-in-charge). This Ceremony was historic as it also marked the migration of the services of the Church from the old Chapel to the Basement of the New Chapel Building for our usual worship.







Church Organisation and Spiritual Growth

Elevation and first Session

At the dedication of the first chapel in May 2004, the Church was also elevated from a preaching post to a full congregational status and christened 'Grace'. Thus, the Grace Congregation of West Legon was born. The first Session of the elevated congregation comprised the following members:

Dedication of the current Church Building and Offices

Worship at the Basement continued from 2013 whilst serious construction work was going on until 2016 when the construction work was completed. All the groups in the Church suspended the group anniversaries and any other celebrations to embarked on a serious day-born fund raising for the whole period. This unique unity of purpose, dedication, selflessness, commitment, sacrifice and hard work paid off when on Sunday the 16th of October 2016, the new Grace Congregation Auditorium and Offices were dedicated and opened for service. *Appendix 5* contains excerpts of Goodwill messages received on the occasion.





Spiritual Development:

The growth of Grace Congregation has been twofold: physical and spiritual. These two complemented each other so well at Grace. Intensive Bible Study was the hallmark of the Church. To spice up the Bible Study Sessions, special topics were selected and special programmes were organized to expatiate the topics. The church also thrived on its special Friday morning prayers, house-to-house evangelism and church charity towards members through prayers, counselling, donations and visitations. All these activities were supported by faithful Prayer Warriors and established Committees.


As part of activities to ensure sustained spiritual growth, in January 2014, the Church went into agreement with a Team from the Grace Evangelistic Ministry at Akropong Akuapem under the leadership of Evangelist Rev. Abboah-Offei, to join the Church at West Legon, on every Public Holiday, for what we termed a 'Prayer Breakfast Meeting'. This to the glory of God has been faithfully observed by both parties to date.

Ministerial Training:

Grace Congregation has over the years, sponsored the training of four Minsters of the Gospel in its twenty-five years journey. The first Minister to be sponsored by the Church was Reverend Dr. Gertrude Owusu. She was commissioned in August 2009. In 2012, our then Catechist, now Reverend Daniel Kwasi Ayim was selected by the then Moderator of the General Assembly, Rt. Reverend Professor Emmanuel Martey, to undergo a "Special" Special Ministerial Training. In

August 2016 two more members of the Church, Reverend Dr. Richard Osei and Reverend Mrs. Comfort Leticia Adjei Yeboah were sponsored for training and were later commissioned.

Spiritual Leadership

Caretakers:

The first Caretaker for the Church was the late Mrs. Juliet Kpentey. She served from 1994 to 1997 after which Mrs. Comfort Thompson took over and served from 1998 to 2008. From 2009, the Church decided to hire out the job of Caretaker.

Catechists

In 2001, the Church sponsored the training of Mr. Daniel Kwasi Ayim, who was a Founding Member, to become the first Catechist of the Church. He served the Church in this capacity faithfully until 2012 when by dint of hard work and dedication to the work of God; he was selected by the then Moderator of the General Assembly, to undergo a "Special" Special Ministerial Training and be ordained as a Reverend Minister. From 2012 to 2019 Mr. Ebenezer Neequaye has acted as the Catechist or the Pastoral Assistant of the Church. Currently Mr. Sampson Kwasi Owusu, a member of the Church has been trained under the sponsorship of the Church to become a Catechist.

Ministers:

Between the dates of the inauguration of the Church in 2004, to the celebration of its Silver Jubilee (2019), the Church has been spiritually overseen by six Reverend Ministers. The first ever Minister assigned to the Church was the Reverend Dr. Erasmus Nii Bonne Odonkor He served from 2006 to 2008. He was instrumental in introducing the two services at the Church specifically the First Service, in English to cater for the spiritual needs of students, foreigners residing around the church and other workers who had to go to work even on Sundays. The Second Service was in the local languages (Ga and Twi). Under his leadership, the church acquired a plot of land at Oyarifa with the intention of building a Manse there.

Following his transfer in 2008, the Church welcomed the Reverend Ishmael Ako Ayeng who also served until 2011 and led the church to begin her expansion journey. In fact, the sod-cutting ceremony to mark the beginning of the construction of the new chapel was performed under his leadership as the Minister-in-charge.

Reverend Professor Cephas Narh Omenyo replaced Reverend Ishmael Ako Ayeng from September 2011 and led the Church with a different kind of spirit – selfless giving. It was during this time that the new church auditorium and office complex was completed and commissioned. Grace Presby Church was highly honoured when on the 24th of August, 2016; our then Minister, Reverend Professor Cephas Narh Omenyo was elected the 17th Moderator of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Ghana at Abetifi. He held on as the Minister-in-charge until December 2016 when he was officially inducted into Office and had to assume duty as the Moderator.

After his departure, Grace Congregation was again blessed this time round with two Ministers. From December 2016 to August 2019 Reverend Dr. Abamfo Ofori Atiemo took over as the Minister-in-Charge. He was assisted by the Reverend Mrs. Baaba Oduro Boateng as an Associate Minister. Together they worked very hard to revive the prayer life of the church. Rev. Dr. Abamfo Ofori Atiemo's term at Grace Congregation was however interrupted by his appointment as the Chairperson of the Europe Presbytery.

In September, 2019, the Church welcomed the current Minister in charge, Reverend Herbert Anim Opong a former Clerk of General Assembly. In October of the same year, the Reverend Mrs. Baaba Oduro Boateng was also transferred.

The Reverend Herbert Anim Opong upon taking Office ensured that the Silver Jubilee Anniversary celebrations came off successfully.

Conclusion

This twenty-five (25) years journey has witnessed many ups and downs just like any human institution. It is only the love, commitment and dedication of members with godly guidance from the successive ministers that has kept the flame burning all these years. Indeed, the Lord Jesus Christ has built his Church and the gates of hell cannot prevail against it. The Grace Family can only thank the good LORD for His abundant blessings. Indeed, His Grace and Mercy has brought us this far.

Dedication of the current Chapel and Office Complex - October 16, 2016

On the occasion of the Dedication of Chapel of the Grace Congregation of the Presbyterian Church of Ghana, West Legon I wish on behalf of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Ghana and on my own behalf, bring you fraternal greetings and warmly congratulate you for the completion of the Chapel building. The Presbyterian Church of Ghana is very proud to be associated with your achievements as part of the Church's mission.

The Psalmist says: "This is the Lord's doing and it is marvelous in our eye" (Psalm11:23) is an evidence that the Lord has been the cornerstone of your Congregation. This may refer to David's preferment; but principally it is to Jesus the Christ. He is the Stone which the builders refused: they would go on in their building without him and this proved the ruin of those who reject him. He is the Chief Cornerstone in the foundation. He is the Chief Top-stone, in whom the building is completed, who must, in all things, have the pre-eminence. Christ's name is Wonderful; and the redemption he wrought out is the most amazing of all God's wondrous works. We will rejoice and be glad in the Lord's day; not only that such a day is appointed, but in the occasion of it, Christ's becoming the Head.

Dedication of Church Buildings gives an ideal opportunity for us to realize the Biblical insight of our standing in Grace and acknowledge our need for personal and institutional repentance. Since the Church is not just a building but rather the "People of God" the occasion is essentially the dedication of the people who worship in the Church Building. As such in the Bible, occasions such as dedication of Temples are filled with the fervor of spiritual renewal of the people.

In Biblical tradition, the Temple has been part of the order of God's revelation and grace. The Temple united the Tribes of Yahweh – Israel – into one nation. There have been three (3) temples in Biblical history which were built and stood successively on Mount Moriah. If we will recall, Mount Moriah was the place where, in response to God's injunction, Abraham was to go and sacrifice his son Isaac (Genesis 22:2)

The first Temple to be built on Mount Moriah in Jerusalem was that of King Solomon (2 Chron. 3:1). It took seven years to complete and was dedicated in the eleventh year of Solomon's reign in around 950 B.C. (1 Kings 6:38; 8:62-63). However, this first Temple was destroyed when the Babylonians under King Nebuchadnezzar burnt Jerusalem in 856 B.C.

The Second Temple was built by Zerubbabel, the Governor of Judah at the time assisted by the High Priest Jeshua (also called Joshua) and the two prophets Haggai and Zechariah (Ezra 5:1-2). The rebuilding was made possible by the decree of Emperor Cyrus of Persia. Compared to the first Temple built by Solomon this second one was less magnificent and smaller. Therefore, when the foundation was laid, while the old men who had seen the first temple wept with sorrow, the young people who were born later in exile shouted for joy (Ezra 3:12; Haggai 2:1-5). This temple was completed in 515 B.C. In the successive centuries this temple was repaired several times.

The third and last Temple built on Mount Moriah in Jerusalem was started by Herod the Great around 20 B.C. This was the Temple Jesus came to meet and which existed at His time. After forty-six years, this Temple was still under construction (John 2:20). It was finally completed in A.D. 64 more than thirty years after Jesus. This Temple was bigger and more magnificent than the two previous ones. Jesus predicted the destruction of this Temple to His disciples (Mark 13:1-2; Matthew 24:1-2; Luke 21:5-6). This actually happened in A.D 70 when the Romans marched on Jerusalem and destroyed the Temple, and as Jesus predicted not a single stone was left in its place – all were thrown down.

Now in the New Testament, the whole Christian community is described as God's "new temple" (1 Cor. 3:16-17; 2 Cor. 6:16-17; Eph. 2:19-22; 1 Pet. 2:5; cf 1 Cor. 6:19-20). Therefore, for us Christians today, while the temple image is used to convey the unity of the Church, we are also challenged to live holy lives that will befit followers of Christ who have tasted the heavenly gift, and become partakers of the Holy Spirit (Hebrews 6:4).

Once again, I congratulate you for your achievement.


















